

Winter Haven Christian School Dual Enrollment Policy

Students at Winter Haven Christian School must adhere to the following criteria in order to take classes at Baptist College of Florida, Polk State College, Southeastern University, and Warner University:

- 1. Students must apply for dual enrollment using the application provided by The Baptist College of Florida, Polk State College, Southeastern University, and Warner University. This application and/or application information is available on our website (whcsonline.org) under the Academics tab, then select "Grades 9-12" and scroll down.
- 2. Students must have a cumulative 3.0 High School GPA or higher to be eligible for dual enrollment.
- 3. Students must maintain a 3.0 High School GPA in order to stay in the dual enrollment program.
- 4. Students may be removed from the dual enrollment program at any time by school administration if the student reaches an unacceptable level of behavior referrals. Student is also subject to Baptist College of Florida, Polk State College, Southeastern University, and Warner University behavior standards, dress code, policies and applicable code of conduct.
- 5. Students will be removed from the dual enrollment class if they earn a failing grade and/or is dropped from a high school, college, or FLVS class.
- 6. Students must have successfully completed at least one high school semester at Winter Haven Christian School in order to be eligible for dual enrollment.
- 7. Students must arrange for their courses to be taken after school dismissal or online.
- 8. Classes at Baptist College of Florida, Polk State College, Southeastern University, and Warner University will count for high school and college credit if approved by administration. It is the responsibility of the student to get the classes approved for high school credit before taking the class.
- 9. Classes will be weighted higher for GPA calculation as per WHCS policies.
- 10. Students may take only 1000 and 2000 level classes at Polk State College.
- 11. Parents and students understand that courses at Baptist College of Florida, Polk State College, Southeastern University, and Warner University are college level classes. It is highly recommended that students start out slowly and get a feel for the rigors of a college level class. In addition, students will be treated as mature adults and as a result they are expected to resolve their own problems and have mature communication with the Professor.
- 12. Parents are responsible for the purchase of books and any classroom lab fees as per Baptist College of Florida, Polk State College, Southeastern University, and Warner University policies. Students who would like additional credits beyond the 2 courses per semester must submit that request to WHCS administration in writing for approval and are responsible for the full tuition amount that is charged by Baptist College of Florida, Polk State College, Southeastern University, and Warner University.
- 13. Students are able to opt out of their Senior year of English if they have completed both dual enrollment Composition I and Composition II courses and have met all other requirements for graduation up to their Senior year.
- 14. Students are able to opt out of their Senior year of math if they have completed both the dual enrollment College Algebra course and have met all other requirements for graduation up to their Senior year.
