Featured speakers were former Congresswoman and Presidential Candidate Michele Bachmann, Senator Tommy Tuberville from Alabama, Senator Ted Cruz from Texas, and House Representative Burgess Owens from Utah.

One evening, Senate Chaplin Dr. Barry Black, the 62nd chaplain of the United States Senate, gave the charge to maintain Bible-centered principles at our schools.

On the final day, Mr. Klein was invited to meet with our Representative in Congress, Scott Franklin, who represents Florida's 18th District. Mr. Klein told Congressman Franklin about our school and what issues are important to the school family. Mr. Klein was Congressman Franklin's personal guest to watch a live vote on the House floor; unfortunately, no photos were allowed to be taken during that vote.

Congressman Franklin was raised in Lakeland and knows where our school is. The Congressman is very supportive of Christian education and supports our school. Mr. Klein has invited him to visit WHCS, and hopefully, the Congressman will come for a visit sometime
